Social & Emotional Learning (SEL)

1. **Purpose:**

Authorizing Legislation -2SSB 5082 (2019 Session) - The purpose is to promote and expand SEL implementation throughout Washington schools. To convene a work group to build upon the work of the social emotional learning work group established under section 36 501(34), chapter 4, Laws of 2015 3rd sp. sess. The SEL Advisory must:

- a. Align standards and benchmarks for SEL with other relevant standards and guidelines including K–12 health and physical education learning standards and the early learning and development guidelines
- b. Develop and implement a statewide framework for SEL that is traumainformed and culturally responsive
- c. Review and update as needed the SEL standards, benchmarks and indicators and confirm they are evidence-based
- d. Develop a model of best practices or guidance for schools on implementing the benchmarks and indicators
- e. Identify SEL strategies to improve coordination between early learning, K– 12 education, youth-serving community partners, culturally-based providers, and higher education
- f. Consider systems for collecting data about SEL and monitoring implementation efforts
- g. Review, update and align, as needed, the SEL online education modules for teachers and educational staff
- h. Engage with stakeholders and seek feedback
- i. Submit recommendations to the education committees of the legislature and the office of the governor by June 1, 2020.
- j. Hold an annual joint meeting with the EOGOAC

2. Description of services provided:

Convene and facilitate monthly meetings with the identified SEL Advisory Committee that builds upon the previous work of the SEL framework.

3. Criteria for receiving services and/or grants:

Legislative mandate to establish the SEL Advisory Committee and complete the work.
