# Legislative Youth Advisory Council

#### 1. Purpose:

The Legislative Youth Advisory Council (LYAC) was created in 2005 (codified in RCW 28A.300.801) to examine issues of importance to youth, including but not limited to education, employment, strategies to increase youth participating in state and municipal government, safe environments for youth, substance abuse, emotional and physical health, foster care, poverty, homelessness, and youth access to services on a statewide and municipal basis.

#### 2. **Description of services provided:**

LYAC members are appointed by the Office of the Lieutenant Governor (OLG). If the council has sufficient funds from any source, the council ha the following duties including but not limited to: Advising the legislature on proposed and pending legislation, including stat budget expenditures and policy matters relating to youth; meeting at least three times but not more than six times per year. If sufficient funds are available from any source, the Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI) shall provide administration, coordination, and facilitation assistance to the council.

Budget Proviso: ESSB 6168, Sec. 501(3)(d) - \$40,000 of the general fund-state appropriation for fiscal year 2020 is provided solely for the legislative youth advisory council. The council of statewide members advises legislators on issues of importance to youth.

## 12. **Other relevant information:**

In FY19 and 20 OSPI entered into an Interagency Agreement with the Office of the Lieutenant Governor in which the OLG administered the program. During the 2020 session, HB 2402 passed, which moves responsibility of administering LYAC to the OLG.
