

History of Agriculture

1. **Purpose:**

Create a series of articles, videos, and educational curriculum on the history of agriculture in Washington, including the role and impact of indigenous and immigrant farmers.

2. **Description of services provided:**

Four complete, ready-to-share lesson plans for middle school students, each containing Teacher's guide, slide deck, articles, student handouts, and beta versions of each accompanying video (3-5 minutes). The scope of work included (1) produce at least one article, video, and education curriculum on the role and impact of indigenous people on the history of agriculture in Washington. (2) produce at least one article, video, and educational curriculum on the role and impact of immigrant farmers on the history of agriculture in Washington (3) Produce at least two articles, videos, and educational curriculum on technology advances and obstacles for agriculture in Washington.

These materials are free for any school district to access and are housed on the Moodle site at OSPI as called out by contract. We have also posted these curriculum material on our OER site at OER Commons.
