- Work to replace any students who are no longer able to participate.

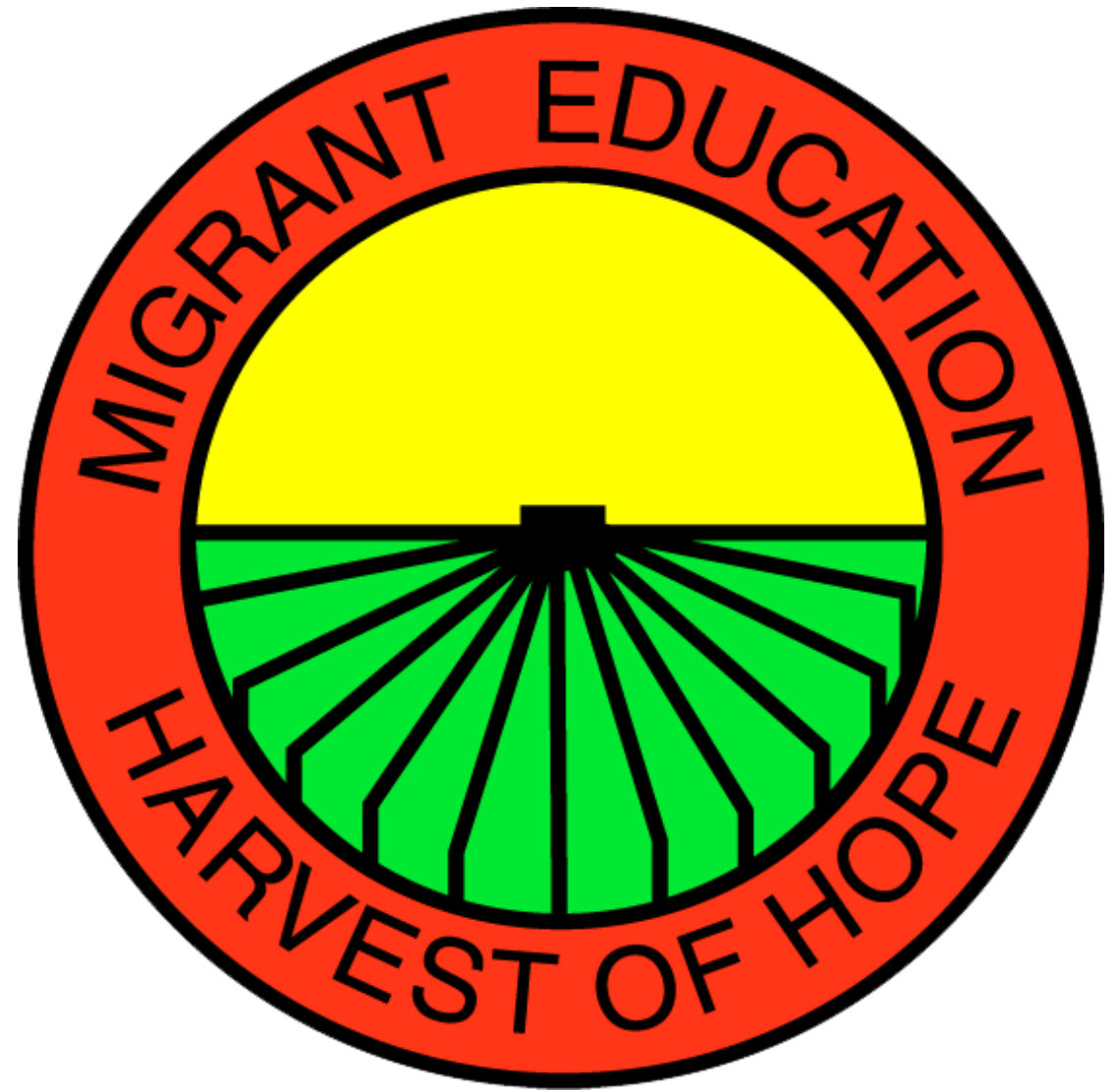

Students enrolled in summer term have until 08/22 to test in PASS courses. At the end of term, Active PASS courses will be auto-withdrawn. Partial credit will be issued for tested units if the average of the unit tests completed during the enrollment period if the average is 60% or higher.

State Advisory Committee: Meetings

- The SAC meets 3-4 times per year.
- Meeting format:
 - Friday evening - member's training
 - Saturday - official meeting at different locations around the state
- All SAC meetings offer interpretation services in Spanish
- The first official meeting will take place sometime in the fall (September/October)



State Advisory Committee: Composition

- a minimum of 15 members and a maximum of 20 members.
- Members represent geographic areas and include:
 - ten migratory parents of children eligible for the program,
 - four migrant students,
 - a migrant teacher,
 - a paraeducator/home visitor/records clerk,
 - a principal,
 - a local school district Migrant Education Program director,
 - a school district superintendent/local school board member,
 - a high school counselor, MGS, or MSA, and
 - a representative of the Commission of Hispanic Affairs.



State Advisory Committee: Logistics

- SAC members are reimbursed for expenses incurred for attending SAC meetings.
- This includes:
 - travel, meals, and lodging expenses.
 - Reimbursements are paid following the state's allowable per-diem rates by the Migrant Student Data, Recruitment and Support office on behalf of the SAC.
 - All SAC meetings are announced and open to the public.

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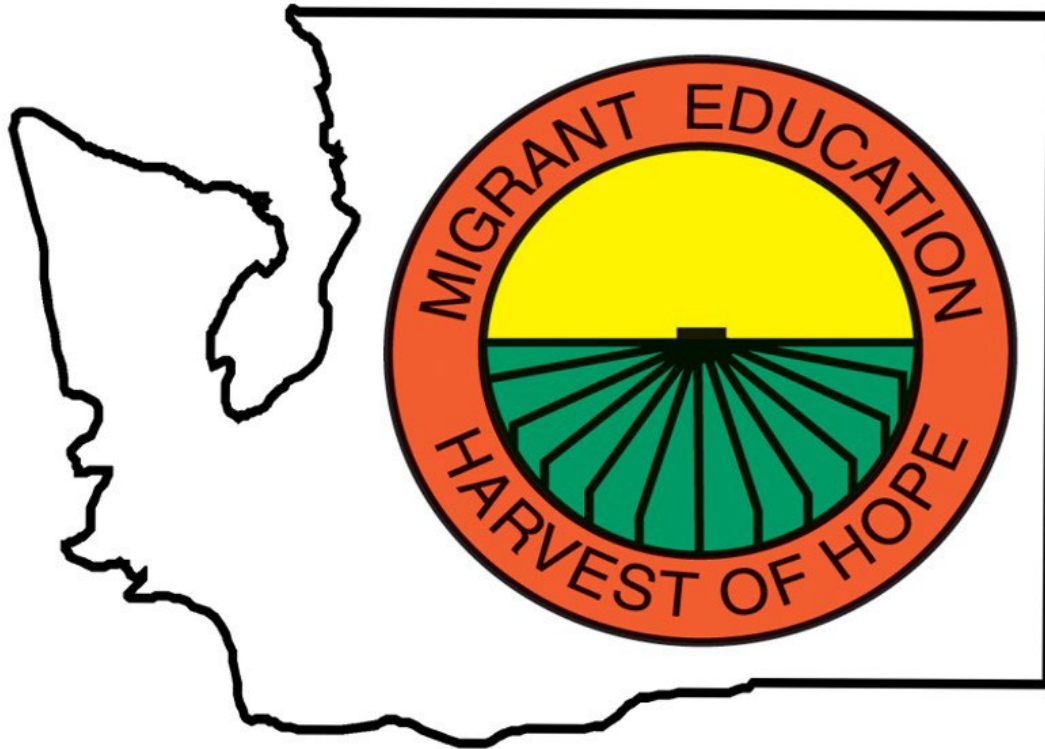
