Management System (EGMS) Updates	An update was provided on EGMS. • 112 applications received.
	26 districts have not started their applications.
	• 132 districts have received their awards.
	• 50 applications need to be reviewed.
	99 applications were sent back for revisions.
	Discussion and questions:
	 Notifications: Only the application owner is notified when the application is sent back for revisions. There are multiple program directors, but only the application owner receives notification. The business manager also does not receive notifications, including when the application has been successfully submitted.
	 Additional training is needed for claims and amendments: We are not able to do a budget amendment when claims are in process? (Rochester not sure if this was a training issue or a limitation of EGMS). Business managers have received less training on their roles than have program directors.
	 Prepopulated counts: We are unsure of the source and were unable to reconcile with other published data.
	 Not enough licenses: When a user is deactivated, do they continue to count towards our license limit? Yakima unable to add users when others were removed. Districts will need additional licenses for Phase
