

Washington School Improvement Framework: Missing Data

Is there something missing from your school's WSIF results? Blank spots? Numbers or student groups missing?

Here are reasons that data might not be displayed in the WSIF:

New Schools	The Washington School Improvement Framework compiles data over several years. For schools that have only been open for a single year, OSPI reports individual measure data. However, we do not calculate overall framework scores for them, and the schools qualify for foundational supports only. In the future, the schools will have been open for a sufficient amount of time to generate an Overall Framework Score.
Grade Spans	Depending on the grade spans of a school, some measures or the overall framework score may not be applicable. For example, some schools serve students only in kindergarten through 2nd grade and will not have data about the statewide ELA or Math assessment. For some schools, there may not be enough measures to calculate an Overall Framework Score.
Closed Schools	Results for schools that are now closed but served students during the time period of the WSIF calculations are included for transparency. These schools do not receive an Overall Framework Score.
No Students in Student Group	If there are no students enrolled in a school in a specific student group during the years included in WSIF, that student group will not appear in that school.
Suppression: Small Number of Students, Top/Bottom Coding, and Cross Group	Data may be suppressed, or removed from view, in three cases to protect student privacy: 1) Student count less than 20 (over three combined years of data) will suppress the numerator and will not receive a decile; 2) Very large or very small rates are suppressed by an algorithm based on how many students are included in the measure; 3) If one group of a student subgroup has been suppressed, the counts of the next smallest group are suppressed while the rate for that group will be displayed.
