PURPOSE/BACKGROUND

House Bill 1658 (2023), High School Credit for Paid Work Experience, was passed by the legislature in 2023 and authorizes public high school students to earn elective credit for paid work experience. The Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI) adopted rules for the new legislation and updated existing Washington Administrative Codes (WAC) related to credit opportunities work experience through Cooperative Worksite Learning and equivalency course of study policy. The revisions to the WAC effective on August 31, 2023, provide consistent guidance of credit opportunities for working students and identify calculations for funding these experiences.

NEW AND REVISED WAC RULES FOR WORK EXPERIENCE

The charts below are intended to clarify the following:

- New WAC rules to guide implementation of <u>HB 1658 (2023)</u>.
- Revisions to existing work experience related WAC for consistency.
- Revisions to all credit ratios in work experience WAC for consistency.
- Revisions to guide apportionment and reporting requirements.

Rules to Implement Elective Credit for Paid Work Experience

Through elective credit for paid work experience, students demonstrate competency in financial education learning standards for employment, income, or financial decision making. Districts are responsible for adopting a policy to guide implementation, approving the paid experience in advance, verifying hours at least once per term, and using the OSPI designated state course code and course designation code for CEDARS reporting. Student paid work hours may occur during the school day or outside of the regular school calendar. Paid work experience scheduled as part of the student's school day may be claimed for basic education apportionment in alignment with WAC 392-121-139.

Districts are required to adopt school board policy to implement elective credit for paid work experience. This does not modify existing requirements for cooperative worksite learning and does not restrict districts from adopting additional policies or implementation practices to create increased student access to worksite learning credit through cooperative worksite learning for nonelective credit or mastery-based learning credit as referenced in <u>WAC 180-51-051</u>.

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IMPLEMENTATION SUPPORT

OSPI has developed guidance documents to support implementation of elective credit for paid work experience and sample forms that are aligned to the requirements for implementation but are optional resources for districts to use. The guidance documents and sample forms are attached to this bulletin.
