What are the Skills Being Screened?

Phonemic Awareness

The ability to hear, identify, move or change the smallest units of sound in spoken words.

Phonological Awareness

Encompasses speech sounds, such as rhyming, alliteration, the number of words in a sentence, & the syllables within words.

Letter-Sound Knowledge

The sounds represented by letters of the alphabet & combinations of letters that make speech sounds.

Rapid Automated Naming Skills

The ability to quickly name aloud a series of familiar items, including letters, numbers, colors, & objects found in a classroom.

What is Included in the Legislation?

What is Dyslexia?

For Washington State, dyslexia means a specific learning disorder that is neurological in origin and that is characterized by unexpected difficulties with accurate or fluent word recognition and by poor spelling and decoding abilities that are not consistent with the person's intelligence, motivation, and sensory capabilities.

Which Students Must Be Screened?

All students in grades K-2, starting in the 2021-22 school year.

What is Required to be Screened?

Rapid Automated Naming Skills (RAN), Phonemic Awareness, Phonological Awareness, and Letter-Sound Knowledge.
