1. Page 10 – Under A.3 – it was indicated that you reserve the right to negotiate or amend the award as it considers more frequent deliveries than once per month, what is the current number of delivery days per month?

Our current delivery schedule to schools is approximately 3 weeks per month.

Delivery drops can only occur once per month from a frozen warehouse and once per month from a dry warehouse, per School District Sponsor

2. During those deliveries, what is the current average delivery size?
Delivery per drop is currently at minimum 20 cases. Routes are ideally configured to start with full loads with multiple drops. However, one drop can also be a full load, it just depends on the location and month.
3. Page 12 – Under A.7 – As stated, the award can be broken up East vs. West, what is the number of large warehouse drop sites for each location?
We don't currently have the information to determine what would be considered a large drop warehouse. The awarded vendor sets the rout to deliver with the delivery period.
4. Will the awarded vendor have input for the timing and quantity of inbound truckloads?
The awarded vendor will have the ability to accept inbound truckloads based on appointments the awarded vendor sets. Quantity of inbound truckloads is set by the State.
