

Right: 1. Conforming with or conformable to law; justice, or morality. 2. Being in accord with fact, reason, or truth.

Privilege: a. A special advantage, immunity, permission, right or benefit granted to or enjoyed by an individual, class or caste. b. Such a right or advantage held because of one's status or rank, and exercised to the detriment or exclusion of others.

Directions: I will be reading a series of statements. Based on your understanding of the above definitions, please walk to the side of the room labeled either Right or Privilege to the statement I read.

Once participants have decided and walked, ask for individuals to share why they have positioned themselves where they have. There will be multiple perspectives and consensus to the statements.

Right or Privilege Statements:

- Getting an education
- Getting a driver's license
- Eating candy in the classroom
- Being able to study in a quiet place
- Breathing clean air
- Drinking healthy water
- Life, Liberty and the Pursuit of Happiness
- Expecting that a treaty or contract will be followed.
