COMES NOW the Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction, under the authority granted by the laws of the state of Washington, having reviewed the file of the above-referenced case, and having considered the entire evidence contained therein, does hereby stipulate by and between the Office of Professional Practices (OPP), Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI), and Scott Storaci, that the Washington Education Certificate, No. 325837C, of Scott Storaci, shall be suspended as set forth in the Order below, based on the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law set forth below:

FINDING OF FACTS

- 1. Scott Storaci was issued a Washington Education Certificate, No. 325837C, on November 22, 1993. This certificate currently remains valid.
- 2. Scott Storaci is employed by the Richland School District.

- 3. On August 22, 2008, the Office of Professional Practices, within OSPI, received a complaint letter from the Superintendent of the Richland School District, Dr. Jean Lane, alleging a lack of good moral character or personal fitness, or a violation of the Code of Professional Conduct, Washington Administrative Code (WAC) 181-87, by Scott Storaci.
- 4. On November 2, 2000, Scott Storaci signed a copy of the Richland School District Electronic Mail and Network Information User Agreement. In 2006, Scott Storaci signed another copy of the Richland School District Electronic Mail and Network Information User Agreement.
- 5. During the 2007-2008 school year, Scott Storaci used his Richland School District assigned computer, at William Wiley Elementary School, to access and view sexually explicit images.
- On August 14, 2008, during an interview with Gault Pettett, Richland School District General Counsel, Scott Storací stated: that he had used his Richland School District assigned computer to intentionally access and view websites that contained sexually explicit images; to play personally owned video games; that he deleted the cookies, files, and internet history after intentionally accessing and viewing websites that contained sexually explicit images; that he knew it was against District policy to view sexually explicit images; and that "it was wrong. I know it".

SCOTT STORACI AGREED ORDER OF SUSPENSION

- 7. The final forensic examination report was completed on August 26, 2008 by Turiss, LLC. During forensic examination, over 300 images containing sexually explicit images were located on Scott Storaci's assigned classroom computer.
- 8. On September 12, 2008, Scott Storaci was issued a Notice of Reprimand and a Suspension without pay for ten (10) days from John Steach, Executive Director of Human Resources for the Richland School District.
- 9. On November 19, 2008, Scott Storaci participated in an interview with an OPP investigator. On February 24, 2009, Scott Storaci submitted a sworn statement to OPP.
- Good moral character and personal fitness is a continuing requirement to maintain a
 Washington Education Certificate.

If Scott Storaci has submitted his fingerprints to both the FBI and WSP by July 12, 2010 and the results are not provided by August 1, 2010, then the suspendent will be reinstated subject to further action by OSPI in the event that one or more criminal convictions that are listed in WAC 181-86-013, RCW 28A.410.090, and/or any felony convictions are revealed.
