Washington State WIDA ELD Standards Rollout Plan

Washington State adopted and began implementing the WIDA English Language Development (ELD) Standards Framework in the 2021–22 school year. All Washington public schools are expected to use these standards to support their eligible multilingual English learners. The WIDA ELD Standards Framework provides an integrated approach that allows teachers to identify Language Expectations that align with each of the four core content areas. It is essential that both ELD specialists and general education teachers become familiar with these standards and learn how to utilize them effectively to support instruction for multilingual learners.

What is WIDA?

Washington is part of the 41-state agency WIDA Consortium that promotes educational equity for multilingual learners through language development standards, assessments, research, and high-quality professional learning for P-12 educators.
