WSNAEAC Early Learning Nomination:

- IPEL has made recommendation for a nominee for WSNAEAC Early Learning Representative.
 - OSPI has not yet received the nomination form; Shandy will send again
 - Shandy and Sally helped facilitate to work collaboratively on initiatives

Tribal Consultation Training (School Directors/Supt) and G2G for Principal Certification Renewal

- Maxine presents overview, timelines, and next steps on two different trainings offered
 - School directors/superintendents (required in <u>SB5252</u>)
 - o Principals G2G (required in <u>HB1426</u>)
- SB5252 lesson plan outline to implement Tribal Consultation
 - 3-hour lesson addresses sovereignty, establishment of Tribes, Tribal government
 & culture, identification
 - WSSDA survey sent out November 18 to Tribal leaders for feedback on how to shape agenda
 - Letter was specific to regional meeting with 5252; gives summary but no background on why it passed
- ESSA requirement to engage in tribal consultation as of January 1, 2023, and to take training every three years; specific components named in legislation
- Law also requires WSSDA to facilitate and convene regional meetings between boards and Tribal councils
- There will be five trainings in regional areas with 35–50 participants in hybrid (first in March); train the trainer possibility
- Trainings would be managed through WSSDA (Eventbright)
 - WSSDA has no regulatory authority, but OSPI does
 - OSPI is authorized under 5252 to engage in rule making and will initiate that process in January 2023
 - o Document participation and certification (clock hours) through sign in



sheets/pdEnroller

- WSSDA will issue certificate which goes to school boards
 - OPSI retains data on participation (pdEnroller)
 - Principal Certification G2G: yes; School Directors: no
- Can we add consultation completion by required personnel in the consultation process?
 - Bring it up during consultation
 - Consultation Assurances form and add to this year's CPR monitoring, which asks for evidence of goals and documentation of completion of training
 - 3-year cycle, monitor over time
 - Curriculum will change over time as trainings progress; different levels of learning as board members attend
 - Maxine will send information out in one-page infographic (regionspecific trainings) and save-the-date message
 - Law requires they engage in training but not attend the regional meeting; so one region won't necessarily receive a notification for another region
 - Similar agendas but different conversations
- Bernie: Produce model MOU between ONE and WSSDA to let folks know what to expect; rationale of why this is important
 - Maxine will provide delineation on trainings and regional meetings and MOUs (PowerPoint)
- Tribal leaders have to be in consultations so hope to get information to ATNI (where leaders are)
 - Consider during meeting in Portland end of January
- WSSDA requirements woven into meetings, not a checkoff list
 - Getting logistics together mid-January
 - Add ATNI to outreach
 - Those involved in work can help shape the outreach and meetings over the next three years
 - Suggest representative from WSSDA in attendance
- Yakama Tribal Council has limited representation at ATNI. The best way to meet with Yakama is during the first full week of the month during tribal council session.
- HB1426 lesson plan outline to implement Principal Training
 - Five 5-hour lessons on G2G relationships
 - Legislative requirements: Addresses sovereignty, establishment of tribes, tribal government
 - Legislative requirements: Understanding colonization & intergenerational trauma
 - Legislative requirements: Understanding Federal and State Al/AN ID

WSSDA Government-to-Government Task Force

- Tim Garchow (WSSDA) shares about task force and budget
 - Convenings are different from trainings
 - Convening planned for three regions of Washington
 - Western Region: Thursday, April 20 | La Conner
 - Eastern Region: Thursday, May 4 | Spokane
 - Central Region: Thursday, May 18 | Yakima
 - WSSDA staff will be reaching out to facilities
 - Invite ONE's input on what catering, facilities, lodging, etc.
 - Every other Thursday from April to May
 - Bernie voices concerns regarding
 - Single student success factors and the need to assess and support urban area family member recognition and funding
 - Apply sociological science towards understanding
 - Federal government moved families into urban areas, no longer considered Indians when off-reservation, having trouble with medical assistance and documentation, important to foster positive student success
 - Tim counters
 - Work with superintendents to reach out to boards to work with Tribes
 - Convenings will help with identification of students where CEDARS or other data misses
 - Survey responses will be reviewed today at noon; will reopen until January 6, 2023
 - OSPIS/WSNAEAC to reach out
 - Need to plan for convening
