- Yes  No If Yes, explain: As directed in Senate Bill 5693, the rules provide for funding participating student's enrollment in running start courses during the summer term. Funding for summer term is based on a two-month count and the first count day is July 1, 2023.

**Purpose:** OSPI is adopting rules to fund participating student's enrollment in Running Start courses during the summer term, as directed in Engrossed Substitute Senate Bill 5693, Section 504 (18), passed by the Washington State Legislature in 2022. The rule revisions open the summer term for Running Start, allow for Running Start enrollment to be claimed on a July and August count day, and change the calculating of the AAFTE to be based on the eleven months of reported enrollment divided by nine. The rule revisions will allow a student who is in grade 11 and 12 for the current school year (school year 2022-2023) and who has available AAFTE to enroll in a college summer term and to be claimed for Running Start funds. The funding for the summer quarter will be based on a two-month count.
