What is Safety Net?

- Funding available to Local Education Agencies (LEAs) that show need for additional special education funding
- Two types of funding:
 - High-Need Individual Based on individual student need
 - Community Impact An LEA factor that is beyond the control of the LEA.
- RCW 28A.150.392
- WACs 392-140-600 685

New this year!

- Rollout of application platform
- Tiered thresholds
 - < 1,000 FTE = \$35,598
 - > 1,000 FTE = \$39,158
- Exception reports no longer required for submission
- Proration percentages reduced

Safety Net Timeline (cont.)

- Committee votes on conditional awards
- OSPI sends award letters to LEAs

- Committee votes on final awards

- OSPI sends award letters to LEAs

- Reconsideration window
- LEAs submit final verification data

Certification

Costs attributable to:


- LEA philosophy,
- Service delivery choice, or
- Accounting practice
 Not legitimate basis for
 Safety Net
- LEA's program is operated in a reasonably efficient manner
- LEA must be making a reasonable effort to provide appropriate services for students in need of special education

- Funding is not an entitlement
- Funding is subject to adjustment and recovery
- Funding may not be available in future years
- Federal Safety Net cannot be used for costs that would otherwise by covered by Medicaid

- Costs associated are associated with providing direct special education and related services for high-need individual applications
- LEA cannot have any unresolved audit issues related to special education.

Demonstration of Capacity

- LEA level
- Calculated on Worksheet A
- Included with both High-Need Individual and Community Impact
- Compares special education expenditures and revenues
- If special education expenditures exceed revenues there will be demonstrated capacity
- Not a guarantee of funding



High-Need Individuals: Worksheet C

- Used to cost out services in the IEP
- Relies on quantification of services in the IEP
- Data needed:
 - Student demographic data
 - Days in school year
 - Teacher base salary and November caseload
 - Classified staff hourly rates
 - Related service provider base salary and contract hours
 - Contracted staff hourly rate
 - Minutes per week (from IEP) student is served (direct service minutes)



High-Need Individuals: Unallowable Costs

- The following are costs that are not eligible for Safety Net funding. This list is not exhaustive.
 - Construction costs
 - Costs not coded to a special education program (21, 24, 26, 29)
 - Consultant costs (not direct services to the student)
 - Teacher training
 - Provider travel to and from work (bus paras traveling with student are allowable)



High Need Individuals: Medicaid

- If your LEA bills for Medicaid and student is Medicaid eligible:
 - Complete the Medicaid Reimbursement Calculator (posted on website)
 - Provider not eligible?
 - complete the Medicaid Provider Eligibility Verification (posted on website)
 - Medicaid reimbursement Calculator is not required to be completed for provider
- If your LEA does not bill for Medicaid and student is Medicaid eligible:
 - Per WAC 392-140-60120 there will be an adjustment for LEAs not billing for Medicaid.



High-Need Individuals: IEP Reviews

- IEP reviews will focus on the following areas of the current IEP developed by a team of required members:
 - Measurable Annual Goals (MAGs)
 - Summary of Service Matrix
 - Signed Emergency Response Protocols (ERP)
 - Behavior Intervention Plans (BIP)
 - Overall transition components, including Courses of Study and Postsecondary Goals



High-Need Individuals: Prorating

- If an IEP does not meet requirements, the application will be prorated.
- For each area identified, the application will be prorated by 5%.

• 1 area: 95%

• 2 areas: 90%

• 3 areas: 85%

• 4 or more areas: 80%

High-Need Individuals: May 10 Deadline

- Use Smartsheet to request unlock of application (https://app.smartsheet.com/b/form/01fed205aa3949bfa7f0a793125901e3)
- For applications initially submitted in March
 - Update Worksheet C forms in EGMS
 - Add student's new IEP or IEP amendment
 - Add any POs, contracts or invoices applicable to the adjustment
- For a student not included in March submission:
 - Create a new student application in EGMS



Community Impact

Applications due May 10

For LEAs above the 15% funding index.

Cannot include students for whom the LEA receives state special education funding

LEAs must identify a quantifiable factor that is beyond the control of the LEA.

Three steps:

- Identify factor
- Present Data
- Quantify

All state funding (Revenue 4121)



Community Impact: 1. Identify Factor

- Identify the factor and make your assertion.
 - demographic, environmental, sociological, or other factor(s) that is causing the LEA to be over the 15% funding cap.
- Example:
 - The LEA is disproportionately impacted with students eligible for special education who are placed in foster care facilities/homes within the boundaries of the LEA.



Community Impact: 2. Present Data

- Present student enrollment data, including SSID numbers, attributed to the factor.
- Provide appropriate comparisons to surrounding LEAs or LEAs of like size throughout the region or state, and statewide data.
- Data included in application may include:
 - LEA enrollment

PUBLIC INSTRUCTION

- Special education enrollment (K–21)
- Special education percentage
- Number of students in foster care receiving special education services
- Number of students in foster care receiving special education services above what you would anticipate

Community Impact: 3. Quantify

- Use the Community Impact Cost Calculator form to calculate the cost associated with the factor.
- Uses the funding formula to calculate the revenue the LEA would get if not for the funding cap.



Community Impact


- Successful applicants demonstrated capacity and identified and quantified a specific factor that created a disproportional representation of students with disabilities receiving special education services causing an adverse fiscal impact.
- Some examples Military Bases, group homes, foster care, residential facilities.

How to Submit

- Submit High-Need Individual applications through EGMS Announcement AN-OSPI-1834
- Submit Community Impact applications through EGMS Announcement AN-OSPI-1835



After Submission

- Committee members are assigned IEPs or Worksheet As for review
- Committee members review Community Impact applications
- OSPI staff review costs submitted on High Need and Community Impact applications
- OSPI staff may follow-up with applicants
- Summary documents are prepared for the Committee meeting



June Conditional Award Meeting

- Committee members review summary documents and vote on conditional awards
- After the meeting OSPI sends conditional award letter
 - Details what is needed for final award



Verifying Final Awards

- In July LEAs submit:
 - expenditure reports through July
 - ESY certification, if applicable
 - requests for review and reconsideration, if applicable
- Final Worksheet A is completed
- Committee members review reconsiderations, if applicable
- Adjustments are made based on ESY, student exit data, and reconsiderations
- Summary documents are prepared for final award meeting



Requests for Review and Reconsideration

- Window for requests is 20 days from the date of the conditional award letter
- Submit in writing (email OK, use EGMS for secure student info)
- Complete Smartsheet form to notify OSPI (https://app.smartsheet.com/b/form/da6032a26639477c8d0be2f1992d1728)

August Final Award Meeting

- Committee members review summary documents and vote on final awards
- The state/federal split is determined at the LEA level
- OSPI prepares final award notifications



State and Federal Funds

- The State/Federal split is determined after final awards are made
- State funds are distributed through apportionment

- Federal funds require submission of a budget in EGMS
- Once approved in EGMS, LEAs need to JV expenditures to Safety Net and claim the funds through the grant claiming system.
