Legislative Report Recommendations

Equity Committee

Google Doc: SEL Recommendations Edits as of 4.18.2023

• SEL and Equity subcommittee provided additional feedback, which has been reviewed. Added input from GR. Some recs have disappeared because we're trying to prioritize. Some items are tasked to the advisory, so they were removed. Others were left in to acquire funding for their implementation.



- We're not looking to add or make any new recommendations. The purpose today is to make sure everything was captured and to make any needed changes.
- Due next week.
- Read and process the recommendation.
- Consensus: Are you in favor of the recommendation (heart), can live with the recommendation (star), or needs revision to be okay (X).
- For those that need revision, provide actionable changes to the recommendation.
- Consensus again.
- Recommendations to the Google doc can be added until Monday. Please make sure comments are specific and actionable.
- Second paragraph was not designed to be equitable. Quotation marks: is that necessary in recommendations to the legislature? Could be perceived as injurious.
- In 3c, there's funding to train all teachers in K–12, but previously PESB support. We should put more thought into support and funding in language.
- How is the funding issue worded in 3d change wording to make ample
 provision of additional resources. Community members should be included in the
 training. Should not hedge on funding, should be able to continue. Regardless of
 funding, we would like the directive to remain in place. SEL should be living and
 breathing in all schools as-is. Funding is great, but the schools should still be
 doing teacher prep, especially when standards are changed. There are ways to
 get the work done without a grant, and they should be encouraged.
- We need to make policies more understandable and the principal or whoever is closer to the situation should have input. So far, if it's being required by the state, they need to do it. SEL assessments of students in general should be part of policy.
- Members read through comments with the opportunity to comment, agree/disagree.
