10:20am	Michaela Miller	 Standing Report Legislative report Centennial Accord Q & A session Henry introduces Michaela and shares her advocacy for our office with these points: Michaela has helped ONE's rapid growth from three to ten staff Michaela had a hand in moving ONE out from under OSSI (Office of System and School Improvement) 	 Legislative Updates Short (60 day) session Decision packages will be submitted in September Legislature not interested in investing in core services (e.g., fixing CEDARS—25 years old) Certification system is newest in agency but is still 15 years old Moving to new technology systems (apportionment, CEDARS, etc.) Antiquated reporting requirements Districts are faced with extreme accountability measures; legislators need to hear this strain on districts and their staffing (capacity and high turnovers) 	 Legislative Updates OSPI to provide updated org chart showing ONE as its own division Need WSNAEAC's support with recommendations to fix foundation, (data system) before summer 2024 Convince legislators to spend the money to fix systems Solve data problems to tell accurate stories Need funding to tell real stories of how districts are being impacted by accountability measures Look at sustainability Let OSPI know if you need state auditor assistance
