# Washington K–12 Learning Standards for Health Education Addendum: Fentanyl/Opioid Use and Abuse

### **Legislative Requirements**

House Bill 1956 was passed by the Washington State Legislature in 2024. It requires the Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI) to address the current health crisis of adolescents' exposure to fentanyl and other opioids by developing and/or disseminating instructional materials and by updating the Washington K–12 Learning Standards for Health Education to include opioids within middle and high school substance abuse education. This addendum addresses the immediate need to address the legislative requirement to update standards. Further revision of the Health Education K–12 Learning Standards will take place during OSPI's upcoming standards review process.

## **Updated Student Learning Outcomes**

Grade-level student learning outcomes included in the Health Education Learning Standards define what all students should know and be able to do at each grade level.
