Request for Proposals No. 2025-02 Addendum 01 – Pre-Bid Conference Q&A

This document is posted to capture the questions received, and agency answers provided, during the Pre-Bid Conference, which was held on August 13, 2024.

Communication directed to other parties will be considered unofficial and non-binding on OSPI, and may result in disqualification of the Consultant.

1. **Question:** How many attendance networks are currently running in Washington using this process, since it is a minimum requirement?

Answer: Breakthrough Improvement Networks focused on Attendance and based on the IHI model were implemented in ESDs 105 and 171 as part of the ESSER Attendance & Reengagement Project, which ended June 30, 2024. Eligible bidders are required to have experience using the IHI Breakthrough Model to run a network focused on attendance in Washington state. This is a requirement because the timeline to launch the networks is so short; OSPI is seeking a consultant who has operated in Washington state and therefore has knowledge of the Washington policy and practice context as well as relationships in Washington schools.

Question: Will only one bidder be selected?
 Answer: Yes. One bidder will be selected for a maximum contract amount of \$140,000.

3. Question: If we are a veteran, minority, and woman owned business with federal certification, do we still need to have those certifications in Washington?
Answer: Registration is not required in Washington. Bidders should provide evidence of any kind of registration that supports their status as a Washington small business, minority-, woman-, and/or veteran-owned business. Please indicate any such status on the Contract Intake Form.

In accordance with the legislative findings and policies set forth in chapter 39.19 RCW, the State of Washington encourages participation in all of its contracts by firms certified by the Office of Minority and Women's Business Enterprises (OMWBE). Participation may be either on a direct basis in response to this RFP or on a subcontractor basis. <u>Business Enterprises</u>. However, no preference points will be included in the evaluation of proposals, no minimum level of MWBE participation shall be required as a condition for receiving an award, and proposals will not be rejected or considered non-responsive on that basis.
