- Progress monitoring provides educators with **real-time** data to adjust interventions, ensuring student success and maximizing resource efficiency.





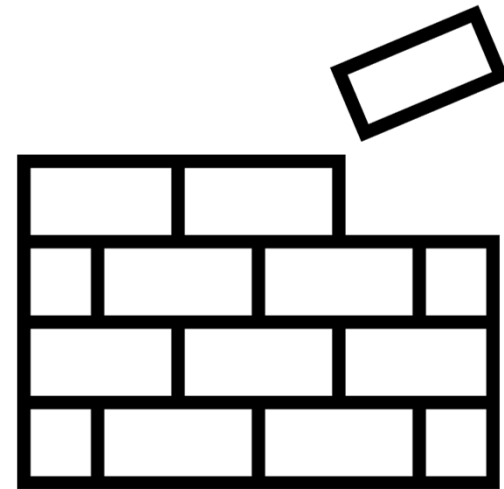
# Why Progress Monitoring Matters

- SMARTIE goals focus interventions with specific, measurable, and inclusive objectives that ensure progress is actionable and equitable.



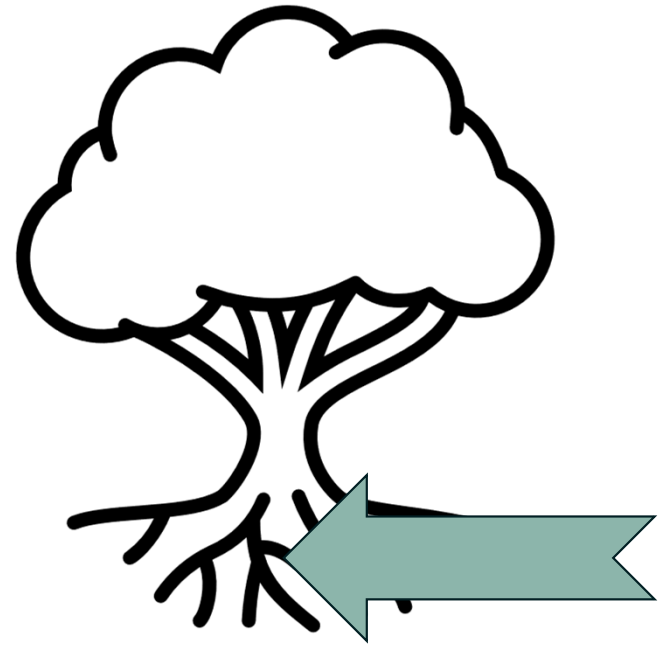
# Using Data to Drive Decisions

- Root cause analysis uncovers the underlying issues that hinder student progress, enabling strategic and impactful solutions.



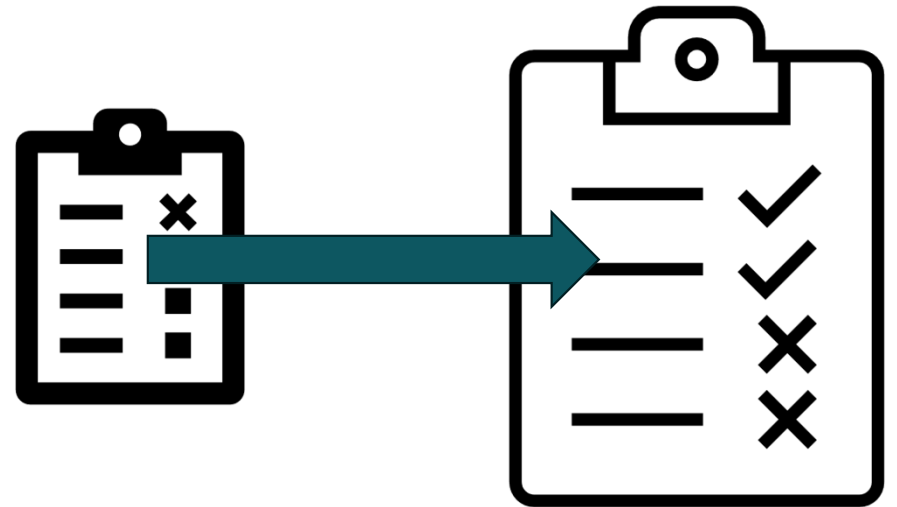
# Collaboration Through Data

- A data-driven culture unites educators with tools, training, and collaboration to achieve shared goals for student success.



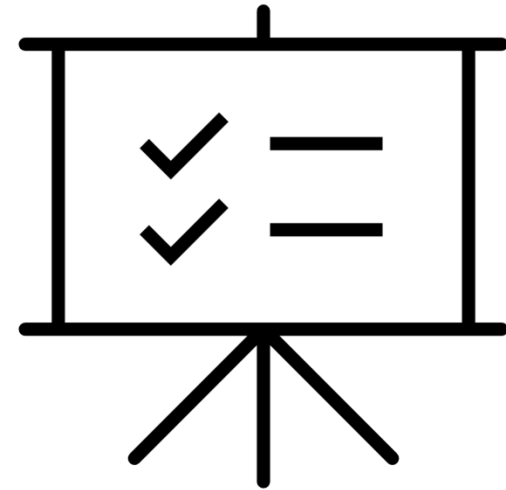
# Appropriate Assessment Usage

- Identifying when and how to use formative versus summative assessment when progress monitoring.



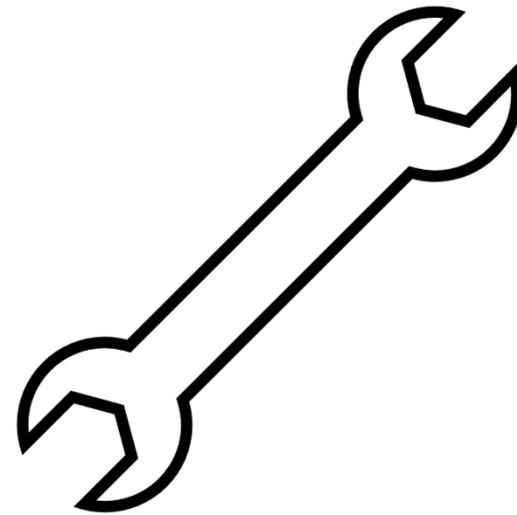
# Clear Goals, Clear Path

- Validated tools and ongoing training equip staff to implement progress monitoring with fidelity and confidence.





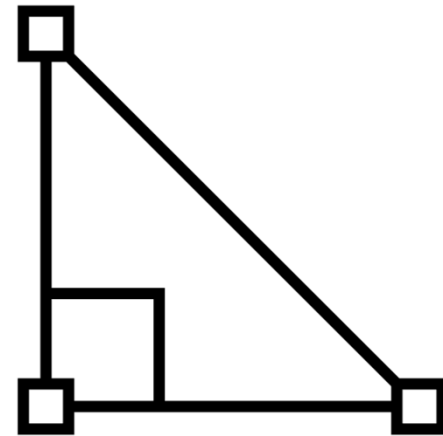
# From Plans to Progress
