


 A trip without a map does not make sense, neither does school improvement goals without progress monitoring.

 SMARTIE goals focus interventions with specific, measurable, and inclusive objectives that ensure progress is actionable and equitable.






Using Data to Drive Decisions


 Qualitative and quantitative data provide a complete view of student performance, guiding timely and precise adjustments to strategies.

Collaboration Through Data


