- Build strong leaders at every level.
- Use of data inquiry/school improvement methods.
- Focus on better teaching practices.
- Apply these efforts through a multi-tiered system of supports.



Focus: Systems and Best Practices for Attendance Improvement

Introduction

Regular attendance is essential for student success. When students miss school often, it can signal broader issues of inequity in schools. Schools work best when they develop systems of support to help students attend regularly.

Theory of Action

Research, school case studies, and attendance data shape our current understanding of how to improve student attendance. Schools can better support their students by using teams to review attendance patterns (tier 1) and identify common barriers that keep students from coming to school (tier 2). These teams should use clear, actionable attendance data that's easy to understand visually. When schools create solutions based on input from students, families, and partners, they can help more students attend school regularly. This approach helps schools build a culture that values attendance, which leads to better student engagement and learning. Schools can use this theory of action to make lasting improvements in student attendance.
