## How to Use the School Improvement Plan Template

To make the School Improvement Plan (SIP) work, follow these steps:

1. Buil	d a Team
	<b>Involve Everyone</b> : Include teachers, staff, parents, students, and community members.
	<b>Assign Tasks</b> : Give each person a clear job, like collecting data or sharing updates.
	nmunicate Clearly
	<b>Hold Meetings</b> : Talk about goals, progress, and problems at parent or community meetings.
	<b>Share Updates</b> : Use newsletters, websites, or posters. Write in simple words.
	<b>Ask for Ideas</b> : Use surveys or suggestion boxes to hear what others think.
3. Find Needs	
	Look at Data: Check student grades, attendance, and other records.
	<b>Spot Gaps</b> : Find where help is needed most, for certain groups of students.
4. Set Simple Goals	
	<b>Make SMARTIE Goals</b> : Goals should be clear, fair, focused, and measure the hoped for improvements.
5. Plan Actions	
	<b>Choose Proven Methods</b> : Pick steps that are known to work. Focus on helping students who need it most.
6. Sho	ow the Plan
	Post Goals: Put the plan on boards or screens where people can see it.
	Focus on Equity: Show how the plan helps all students.
7. Wo	rk Together
	Involve Everyone: Let families, staff, and students help make decisions.
	Celebrate Wins: Thank people for their work with events or posts online.
8. Check Progress	
□ .	Track Results: Review how the plan is working.
	Make Changes: Fix what does not work as you go.
