Purpose of the proposal and its anticipated effects, including any changes in existing rules: In alignment with SSSB 5882 (2024), passed by the Washington State Legislature in 2024, OSPI is proposing rulemaking to establish requirements for school districts to utilize allocated funding for the 2024-2025 school year to support paraeducators, office support, and noninstructional aides. Additionally, consistent with legislative directive to collect data on the use of allocations, the rules would require local education agencies to provide reports that detail the uses of the allocations.  Reasons supporting proposal: The proposed rulemaking is consistent with legislative directives under SSSB 5882 (2024) to require school districts to utilize allocated funding in the 2024-2025 school year to support certain staff types, including paraeducators, office support, and noninstructional aides. In addition, as directed by the Washington State Legislature, the proposed rule language would require school districts to provide data on how the increased allocations are used.
