Courses on this listing are approved by the Professional Educator Standards Board (PESB) for the roles indicated above. These approved courses satisfy the fifteen clock hours/one semester hour of course work required by <u>WAC</u> <u>181-79A-224</u> for Initial Educational Staff Associate (ESA) certification purposes.

The approved courses prepare the candidate to:

- Demonstrate an understanding of school and special education laws and policies (national, state, and local) and their application to decision-making processes in the educational settings.
- Understand and demonstrate knowledge of working within the culture of the schools, creating an environment that fosters safety, health, and learning for the students.
- Demonstrate knowledge of appropriate resources in the school setting.
- Demonstrate knowledge of collaboration with team members which may include parents, teachers, administrators, and others to support learning outcomes for all students.
- Demonstrate knowledge of how to support the outcomes for all students through strategies such as scientificbased practices, collaborative teaming, and ethical decision making.
- Use professional standards to inform professional growth planning.
- Demonstrate an understanding of the use of human, community, and technological resources.

Applicants who meet all requirements other than the ESA course may be issued a temporary permit valid for up to one calendar year. The permit allows the ESA to serve in the role within the P–12 public schools of Washington state.
