PURPOSE/BACKGROUND

The Revised Code of Washington (RCW) <u>28A.235.160(4)</u> requires school districts offering academic, enrichment, or remedial programs during the summer months at qualifying sites to operate a meal program. Qualifying sites are defined as schools that have 50% or more of the children enrolled during the regular school year who qualify for free and reduced-price meals. Local Education Agencies (LEAs) may operate the Seamless Summer Option (SSO) or the Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) at a site where an academic summer school program is in session. Meal service at SSO and SFSP sites must be open to children in the community as well as summer school children. The purpose of this bulletin is to release the Seamless Summer Option (SSO) application for local education agencies (LEAs) during traditional summer operation in 2025. Information on applying for the SFSP can be found in <u>B010-25 Summer Food Service Program New Sponsor Application Materials</u> and <u>B011-25 Summer Food Service Program Returning Sponsor Application Materials</u>.

The SSO is a United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Child Nutrition Program that provides reimbursement to program sponsors for meals and snacks served to children during

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the summer months. The SSO combines features of the National School Lunch Program (NSLP), School Breakfast Program (SBP), and Summer Food Service Program (SFSP), offering a streamlined approach to LEAs already participating in NSLP. Only public and private LEAs already participating in NSLP are eligible to operate SSO. For general information about the program, visit the SSO webpage. The Assistance Listing number for SSO Breakfast is 10.553 and for SSO Lunch is 10.555.

THE APPLICATION PROCESS

The SSO application is a two-part process: Annual Training and the Washington Integrated Nutrition System (WINS) application. Use the <u>Seamless Summer Option Application Checklist</u> to assist with gathering and submitting the required information. Once all steps are completed, submit required documentation to the <u>Summer Meals team</u>.

1. Complete Annual Training.

Sponsors must complete <u>Seamless Summer Option (SSO) online canvas course</u> to participate in the program. The information provided will assist in administering and operating the SSO.

Training requirements and information is located on the <u>SSO webpages</u> in addition to the <u>Seamless Summer Option Application Checklist</u>.

2. Submit Sponsor Application, Site Applications, and Site Calendars in WINS.

WINS is a web-based electronic system used to collect sponsor and site information, as well as process claims for reimbursement.

- LEAs may need to contact their WINS sponsor administrator or the <u>Summer</u>
 <u>Meals team</u> to gain access to SSO in WINS.
- a. Staff Contact information must be entered or updated when completing the sponsor application.
 - i. The <u>Updating Sponsor Contacts Information Sheet</u> is available in WINS.
- b. Detailed resources and training videos on how to navigate in WINS are available on the Child Nutrition Services (CNS) WINS webpage.

APPLICATION DUE DATE

Applications are due by **June 1, 2025**. Regulations require State agencies to process complete and correct applications within 30 days of the submission date. Meals served prior to application approval cannot be claimed for reimbursement. Applications received after the federal deadline of June 15, 2025, will not be accepted.

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Assurance of Civil Rights Compliance

This assurance is binding on the Sponsor, its successors, transferees and assignees as long as it receives assistance or retains possession of any assistance from USDA.
