Supplement very good for the specific topic of boundaries and consent. The link for healthy and unhealthy relationships does not work (page unavailable). Only uses typical role play that most people hate to participate in for peer interactions

#### Reviewer 378

The Healthy Relationships (Boundaries & Consent) curriculum is well-suited for high school students, providing essential instruction on healthy communication, boundary-setting, and relationship skills. It effectively supports students in recognizing the characteristics of both healthy and unhealthy relationships. However, there are accessibility issues within the curriculum. The third link under "Aligned Standards, Performance Indicators, and Essential Questions"—National Sexuality Education Standards (Second Edition)—leads to a 404 error. Additionally, the third link under "Resource Materials"—"Characteristics of Healthy & Unhealthy Relationships"\*—directs users to an unavailable site. To ensure full access to all instructional components, these links should be updated or replaced with functional resources.

#### Reviewer 382

This lesson is very clear about consent and boundaries. It is relevant to all students, provides helpful educator notes and clear teaching for students. The activity gives adequate space for



students to think about and discuss boundaries they have or need to consider in various situations that they may not normally think of ahead of time.

Before the lesson discussion about opting out options are sensitive to recognizing covering this subject can be triggering.

Clear slide show introduction and steps the educator/ teacher through the lesion with notes for each slide. These notes are clear and unbiased.

Has possible answers to the situation/ response activity to help share if students are not wanting to share. Helps students practice uncomfortable situation to set boundaries. Examples of different ways to say No. Simple definitions of boundaries are provided
