**Purpose:** The Washington State Legislature enacted Substitute Senate Bill 5933 in 2022, which requires the Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI) to implement the School Seismic Safety Program to allow districts to receive seismic funds and be eligible to receive funding from the School Construction Assistance Program (SCAP). In alignment with SSB 5933 (2022), the emergency rules establish grant funding procedures concerning the School Seismic Safety Program. OSPI's current school construction rules do not provide a process that would allow OSPI to timely or effectively award these grant funds during the biennium.

OSPI will also conduct permanent rulemaking concerning the School Seismic Safety Program.
