Chapter 392-344 WAC – State assistance in providing school plant facilities—Procedural regulations. Chapter 392-347 WAC – State funding assistance in providing school plant facilities—Modernization.

Establish new chapter: Chapter 392-902 WAC - School Seismic Safety Grant Program.

Statutes authorizing the agency to adopt rules on this subject: RCW 28A.525.020; RCW 28A.525.320

Reasons why rules on this subject may be needed and what they might accomplish: The Washington State Legislature enacted Substitute Senate Bill 5933 in 2022, which requires the Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI) to implement the School Seismic Safety Program to allow districts to receive seismic funds and be eligible to receive funding from the School Construction Assistance Program (SCAP). In alignment with SSB 5933 (2022), OSPI is considering rulemaking concerning the School Seismic Safety Program. OSPI's current school construction rules do not provide a process that would allow OSPI to timely or effectively award these grant funds during the biennium. New grant funding procedures are necessary to preserve the general welfare by allowing OSPI to proceed with the grants and distribution of funding to school districts in accordance with legislative intent.
