PURPOSE/BACKGROUND

In 2024, the Washington State Legislature passed <u>Senate Bill 5462</u> (SB 5462), legislation that contained sections affecting policies on instructional materials.

SCHOOL DISTRICT REQUIREMENTS FOR REPORTING

Senate Bill 5462 requires that, by October 1st, school district boards of directors, charter schools, and state-education tribal compact schools must:

- Adopt or amend their policies and procedures governing curriculum adoption and the selection of instructional materials to conform with the updated <u>Washington State</u> <u>School Directors' Association (WSSDA) Model Policy 2020/2020P Course Design,</u> <u>Selection, and Adoption of Instructional Materials.</u>
- 2. Provide notice of the completed actions to the Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI) within ten (10) days of completing the policy and procedure updates. Schools must provide notice to OSPI through OSPI's confirmation site portal. In the portal, school leaders will be directed to provide confirmation through a direct link to the updated policy/procedure or by uploading copies of the updated policy/procedure.
