## PURPOSE/BACKGROUND

The federal [McKinney-Vento Act \(42 USC CHAPTER 119, SUBCHAPTER VI, Part B: Education for Homeless Children and Youths\)](#) requires every local education agency (LEA) to designate an appropriate staff person, able to carry out the duties described in the law, as an LEA liaison for homeless children and youths. Also, the Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI) is required to publish an updated list of the liaisons annually on the state education agency's (SEA) website.

NOTE: The district liaison or building point of contact for students experiencing homelessness may also serve as the district liaison or building point of contact for students in foster care, respectively. ## REQUIRED HOMELESS EDUCATION LIAISON CONTACT INFORMATION

Please check the [Homeless Education Liaison Contact List](#) to ensure your district's contact information is current. Districts should verify their Homeless Liaison contact information and make necessary updates **no later than September 30th**. The most current liaison contact information should also be posted to district websites and in all McKinney-Vento print materials, including posters and brochures and other resources. **At least one district**

**employee included on the OSPI liaison contact list must be available through the summer months to ensure families have appropriate contact information throughout the year.** In

addition to the Homeless Liaison's contact information, the district may wish to add other district staff members to the contact list such as the Student Services Director, the Federal Program Director, the district Business Manager, the local Superintendent, or other suitable district staff members.

## **REQUIRED TRAINING PARTICIPATION RECORDS**

In addition to routinely updating the liaison contact list, districts have a duty to maintain current Homeless Liaison training records. Per the McKinney-Vento Act, SEAs are required to provide professional development opportunities for LEA personnel and the LEA liaison ([Sec.11432 \(f\)](#)) and adopt policies and practices to ensure participation by liaisons in professional development and other technical assistance ([Sec.11432\(g\)\(J\)\(iv\)](#)).

To maintain accurate Homeless Liaison training records and ensure all liaisons have participated in required professional development pertaining to the education of homeless children and youths, please update the [liaison training records](#) found on the OSPI website. This information is to be updated at the start of the school year and periodically throughout the year. District liaisons are strongly encouraged to maintain all homeless education training records at the local level as evidence of compliance.

## **REQUIRED BUILDING POINTS OF CONTACT**

In addition to the district-level liaison, [RCW 28A.320.142](#) requires each K–12 public school in the state to designate a Homeless Education Building Point of Contact in each elementary school, middle school, and high school. The school district's homeless student liaison is responsible for training the building points of contact to ensure they have the knowledge necessary to identify and serve eligible students at the school level.

Best practice is to maintain a record of the building points of contact at the local district level and make the list publicly available on the district's website, along with other district information annually provided to families.

District-level liaisons, as well as building points of contact, should sign up for the Homeless Education weekly GovDelivery Newsletter. The newsletter includes information about grant funding, upcoming training, policy updates, and other information related to serving students experiencing homelessness.
