PURPOSE/BACKGROUND

The Federal McKinney-Vento Act (42 USC CHAPTER 119, SUBCHAPTER VI, Part B: Education for Homeless Children and Youths) requires all school districts to identify, enroll, and serve children and youths living in homeless situations. The Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI) is required to annually collect and report district-level data regarding homeless children and youths enrolled in public schools. The deadline for districts to review and submit any changes to their 2024–25 homeless student data in CEDARS, accessed in OSPI's Education Data System (EDS), is October 31st.

To avoid identification and reporting errors, it is imperative that district staff members are familiar with the broad definition of homelessness as clearly outlined in the McKinney-Vento Act.

All students meeting the McKinney-Vento definition of homeless, regardless of whether they received specialized district services, must be identified and counted. Please refer to the attached Identification of Children and Youth Experiencing Homelessness document for detailed information on the identification of children and youth who meet the federal definition of homeless according to the McKinney-Vento Act.



- 1. Select the "Reports" tab.
- 2. Select the "Enrollment" tab.
- 3. On the Enrollment page, select "District Student Attribute Enrollment" from the options on the left side of the page.
- 4. On the District Student Attribute Enrollment page, find the "Attribute Type" pull down menu.
- 5. From the menu, select "Homeless Student".


