concerning running start in alignment with Second Substitute House Bill 1316 (2023) and ESSSB 5670 (2024), students who
are age twenty-one (21) and receiving special education services in alignment with Substitute Senate Bill 5253 (2025), and
changing the first Running Start count day of a college term to clarify which students can be claimed for Running Start
funding.
OSPI will conduct permanent rulemaking concerning these rules.
