Knowing

Does every team member understand the district and school goals—not just
repeat them?
Can staff explain how their daily work connects to those goals?
Has your team used tools like process mapping to make alignment visible?
Are teams using updated student data tied to the LCAP and SIP?

Top Tip: Move beyond memorization. Make sure every person can explain their role in reaching the goal.

Believing

Do staff see visible wins across classrooms and teams—not just in isolation?
Are successes tied to evidence-based practices (EBIs) that connect back to district
or school goals?
Does your school schedule regular cross-team data walks or learning showcases
to share success stories?

Top Tip: Create moments for staff to see real results from their own school. Belief grows when success is visible.

Receiving Relevant Feedback

Is feedback timely, specific, and directly fied to school goals?
Are meetings focused on the most important data, not every piece of data?
Does your team use a simple rubric to keep feedback clear and consistent?

Top Tip: Feedback should tell a clear story—where you are, what progress looks like, and where gaps remain.



The Cost of Not Implementing

Have you scheduled checkpoints early (planning meetings, data reviews,
community updates)?
Are course corrections built into your improvement plan?
Do staff understand the risk of small missteps multiplying over time?

Top Tip: Plan early and adjust often. Small corrections now prevent big problems later.

Conclusion

Do all staff know, believe, and receive clear feedback tied to goals?
Are successes shared openly so confidence grows across the school?
Are leaders modeling clarity, belief, and follow-through?

Final Tip: Confidence is contagious. Build it early, spread it widely, and watch your team achieve more together.
