PURPOSE/BACKGROUND

The purpose of this bulletin is to release the 2026 Summer Meal Program application materials for returning Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) sponsors and interested Seamless Summer Option (SSO) local education agencies (LEAs). For guidance on selecting which program to operate, please refer to [OSPI's Summer Meals Comparison chart](#), which outlines the key differences between SFSP and SSO to help sponsors determine which option best aligns with their organization's operations.

- The SFSP is a United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Child Nutrition Program that provides reimbursement for meals and snacks served to children during the summer months. For general information about the program, visit the [SFSP webpages](#). The Assistance Listing Number for the SFSP is 10.559.

- The SSO is a USDA Child Nutrition Program that provides reimbursement to program sponsors for meals and snacks served to children during the summer months. Compared to SFSP, the SSO combines features of the National School Lunch Program (NSLP), School Breakfast Program (SBP), and SFSP, offering a streamlined approach to LEAs already participating in NSLP. Only public and private LEAs already participating in NSLP are eligible to operate SSO. For general information about the program, visit the [SSO webpage](#). The Assistance Listing number for SSO Breakfast is 10.553 and for SSO Lunch is 10.555.

[RCW 28A.235.160\(4\)](#) requires school districts offering any sort of academic, enrichment, or remedial program during the summer months at qualifying sites to offer a food program. Qualifying sites are defined as schools that have 50 percent or more of the children enrolled during the regular school year who qualify for free and reduced-price meals. School districts intending to operate the SFSP or the SSO at a site where an academic summer school program is in session must ensure the meal service is open to children in the community as well as summer school children. A school district that wishes to only provide meals to students enrolled in an academic summer school program cannot participate in the SFSP or SSO.

Sponsors must maintain separate financial records, documentation, and claims by program. Costs must be allocable, allowable, and reasonable to the specific program under which reimbursement is claimed. Costs may not be co-mingled across programs.

WHICH APPLICATION PROCESS TO FOLLOW

There are two (2) bulletins outlining the Summer Meal Program application process. This bulletin is intended for organizations that operated SFSP in Summer 2025 or LEAs interested in operating SSO.

If your organization is interested in applying for SFSP but did not operate in Summer 2025, please see *B0XX-26: SFSP Application for New Sponsors* for application instructions.

THE APPLICATION PROCESS – RETURNING SPONSORS

The application process for returning SFSP sponsors and LEAs interested in SSO includes the following steps:

1. Training

- **SFSP:** Returning sponsors applying to SFSP are required to complete returning sponsor training. The information provided will assist in administering and operating the SFSP. Training information is located on the [SFSP training webpage](#) under the 'Returning Sponsor Training' dropdown, in addition to the attached Application Checklist.

- **SSO:** LEAs applying to the SSO must complete [Seamless Summer Option \(SSO\) online canvas course](#) to participate in the program. The information provided will assist in administering and operating the SSO. Training requirements and information are located on the [SSO webpages](#) in addition to the [Seamless Summer Option Application Checklist](#).

2. Program Application

The *Summer Food Service Program Application Information for Returning Sponsors (Attachment 1)* and the *Seamless Summer Option Application Checklist (Attachment 3)* provide descriptions about program information you will need to complete the application process.

a. Application Checklist

- **SFSP:** Use the '*Checklist for Sponsors Intending to Operate SFSP in Summer 2026*' (*Attachment 2*)

Once all required steps are completed, submit the documentation listed in the SFSP checklist via the [2026 Application Submission Survey](#). Note that this 2026 Submission Survey is part of the formal application process, and your application will not be considered complete without this portion.

- **SSO:** Use the *Seamless Summer Option (SSO) Application Checklist for Summer 2026* (*Attachment 3*) to assist with gathering required information for application approval.

b. WINS Application

- Complete the online application in the Washington Integrated Nutrition System (WINS). WINS is an online system used to collect sponsor and site information, and to process claims for reimbursement. Staff Contact information must be entered or updated when completing the sponsor application. The [Updating Sponsor Contacts Information Sheet](#) is available in WINS. Detailed resources and training videos on how to navigate in WINS are available on the [Child Nutrition Services \(CNS\) WINS webpage](#).

c. Permanent Agreement

- Sponsors of USDA Child Nutrition Programs enter into a permanent agreement at the time of their initial approval. This agreement stays in effect during subsequent years of approved program operation. To view the Child Nutrition Programs Permanent Agreement terms and conditions please reference your copy or the [Sample Permanent Agreement](#).

APPLICATION DUE DATE

The state deadline for application submissions depends on the program you are applying to operate. Regulations require State agencies to process complete and correct applications within 30 days of the submission date. Meals served prior to application approval cannot be

claimed for reimbursement. Applications received after the federal deadline of June 15, 2026, will not be accepted.

- **SFSP:** The application deadline is based on the results of your last Administrative Review and/or your first day of program operations.

Sponsor Category	The application due date by:
Sponsors that had Significant Operational Problems in their 2025 Review	April 15
Returning Sponsors that are new to Rural Non-Congregate Operation	May 1
All Other Sponsors should apply based on the first day of program operations:	
Between June 1-15	May 15
Between June 16-30	May 31
After June 30	June 1

- **SSO:** All LEAs should submit their completed SSO application by **June 1, 2026**.

Sponsors are responsible for ensuring timely submission of all required documentation. Incomplete applications may delay approval and impact claim allowability.

Assurance of Civil Rights Compliance

The Sponsor hereby agrees that it will comply with: i. Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (42 U.S.C. 2000d et seq.); ii. Executive Order 13166, "Improving Access to Services for Persons with Limited English Proficiency." (August 11, 2000); vii. All

provisions required by the implementing regulations of the Department of Agriculture (USDA) (7 CFR Part 15 et seq.); viii. Department of Justice Enforcement Guidelines (28 CFR Parts 35, 42 and 50.3); ix. Food and Nutrition Service (FNS) directives and guidelines to the effect that, no person shall, on the grounds of race, color, national origin, sex, age, or disability, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or otherwise be subject to discrimination under any program or activity for which the Program applicant receives Federal financial assistance from USDA; and hereby gives assurance that it will immediately take measures necessary to effectuate this Agreement. x. By accepting this assurance, the Sponsor agrees to compile data, maintain records, and submit records and reports as required, to permit effective enforcement of nondiscrimination laws and permit authorized USDA personnel during hours of program operation to review and copy such records, books, and accounts, access such facilities and interview such personnel as needed to ascertain compliance with the nondiscrimination laws. If there are any violations of this assurance, the Department of Agriculture, FNS, shall have the right to seek judicial enforcement of this assurance. This assurance is binding on the Sponsor, its successors, transferees and assignees as long as it receives assistance or retains possession of any assistance from USDA.
