LAP Funding: Preliminary FRPL Percentage for 2026–27 Now Available

Preliminary FRPL Percentages for the 2026–27 School Year for Learning Assistance Program (LAP) and High Poverty School LAP funding are on the School Apportionment and Financial Services (SAFS) webpage and OSPI's [2026-27 Budget Preparation website](#). This [file](#) shows the FRPL percentages that will be used for 2026–27 LAP funding, and for determining which schools will be eligible for 2026–27 High Poverty LAP funding.

This file is preliminary and uses data from a CEDARS October 1, 2025 extract as of January 31, 2026. There are two tabs—one that shows the local educational agency's (LEA) FRPL percentage and one showing the school's FRPL percentage.

The Hunger-Free Schools Act of 2020 amended RCW 28A.150.260 and created two provisions for schools and LEAs operating the United States Department of Agriculture's (USDA) Community Eligibility Provision (CEP). LEAs and schools that qualify for these provisions are included in this spreadsheet.

This [file](#) is intended to give LEAs a chance to review their FRPL percentages now and make any necessary corrections to the CEDARS reporting. This preliminary spreadsheet will be updated with data as of February 28. **The final LAP FRPL file will use the October 1, 2025, extract as of March 31, 2026.** Please make sure this data is accurate as of March 31, 2026. No changes will be accepted after March 31, and there is no appeals process.
