

How is it to be used?

OSPI compiles information from the SEES application and the Comprehensive Education Research and Data System (CEDARS) into a Tableau workbook. LEAs can use the workbook to identify, address, and ensure students' equitable access to teachers with an Ineffective status as well as compare the students' equitable access across schools and against averages at other organizational levels. If LEA staff identify discrepancies in their districts' records, corrections must be made in the applicable source system, not in the Tableau workbook.

Who is it for?

The Student Access to Effective Teacher Comparison Workbook is for LEA administrators who submit the SEES data; ensure federal and state compliance; coordinate the use of Title I, Part A and Title II, Part A funds; make personnel decisions and plan for school and district improvement efforts. They can access and review their district's data in Tableau via their EDS account's Application List.

What is its timeline?

The Student Access to Effective Teacher Comparison Workbook displays data from the 2017–2018 school year through the most recently available school year. Data for the most recently completed school year is typically made available in December or January and is updated annually. The availability and accuracy of the data depend on the timely submission of the data by LEAs. Notifications regarding the comparison workbook and related data validation activities are sent to subscribers of the Educator Equity Data Collection topic through OSPI's [Granicus](#) (formerly Gov Delivery) communication system.

How can you get help with this?

To access the workbook, ask your [district data security manager](#) to assign you the Tableau SecureDataPortal-Educator Interactor user role (see page 11 of the [EDS User Role Matrix](#)). Once the role has been assigned, please allow up to 24 hours for access to be activated. Districts' staff can access and review their districts' data through the Tableau Server in the Education Data System (EDS).

The Start Here tab in the Student Access to Effective Teacher Comparison Workbook includes navigation instructions and an FAQ section to help users understand and use the workbook.
