FINAL ORDER OF
MANDATORY PERMANENT
REVOCATION

After receiving and investigating a criminal record report authorized by law pursuant to RCW 28A.410.090(1)(a) regarding the above referenced educator, and based upon the facts available as of the date of this Proposed Order, the Superintendent of Public Instruction, through his undersigned designee, institutes this proceeding and finds, as described below, that JEREMY CAMPBELL (“Educator”) demonstrated a lack of good moral character and personal fitness pursuant to WAC 181-86-013(1) and does hereby PERMANENTLY REVOKE the Educator’s Washington Education Certificate No. 543439D pursuant to RCW 28A.41.090(4)(c), based on the following Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law:

I. FINDINGS OF FACT

1. On March 2, 2018, the Educator was issued Washington Education Certificate No. 543439D. The Educator’s certificate does not have a printed expiration date.
2. On October 16, 2018, the Office of Professional Practices (“OPP”) within the Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction (“OSPI”) learned the Educator demonstrated a lack of good moral character and personal fitness pursuant to WAC 181-86-013(1).

3. The Educator possessed material depicting children as young as nine years old engaged in sexually explicit acts.

4. On March 9, 2018, a criminal complaint was filed against the Educator in the District Court of the First Judicial District of the State of Idaho, charging him with six (6) counts of Sexual Exploitation of a Child by Possession of Sexually Exploitive Material, Idaho Code 18-1507(2)(a), Case No. CR-F18-3817.

5. On May 24, 2018, the Educator pleaded guilty to two (2) counts of Sexual Exploitation of a Child by Possession of Sexually Exploitive Material, Idaho Code 18-1507(2)(a).

6. On October 11, 2018, the Educator was sentenced after pleading guilty to two (2) counts of Sexual Exploitation of a Child by Possession of Sexually Exploitive Material, Idaho Code 18-1507(2)(a), to 1 1/2 years on each count to be served concurrently, along with court costs totaling \$545.50.

II. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. Chapter 28A.410 RCW gives the Professional Educator Standards Board the authority to develop regulations determining eligibility for and certification of personnel employed in the common schools of the state of Washington. OSPI acts as the administrator of those statutes and regulations and has the authority to issue, reprimand, suspend, and revoke education certificates. RCW 28A.410.010; RCW 28A.410.090. Chapters 181-86 and 181-87 of the Washington Administrative Code (WAC) further implement OSPI's authority.

2. OSPI has jurisdiction over the Educator and the subject matter of this action.

3. Pursuant to WAC 181-86-070, there is clear and convincing evidence the Educator lacks the good moral character and personal fitness to teach in Washington State.

4. On May 24, 2018, the Educator pleaded guilty to two (2) counts of Sexual Exploitation of a Child by Possession of Sexually Exploitive Material, Idaho Code 18-1507(2)(a). Such a plea mandates OSPI to permanently revoke the Educator's certificate pursuant to RCW 28A.410.090(4)(c), RCW 28A.400.322(2)(j), and WAC 181-86-075(1). Even if the crimes against children committed by the Educator did not mandate a revocation, an analysis of the Educator's conduct under the eleven factors enumerated in WAC 181-86-080 supports a permanent revocation.

5. Pursuant to RCW 28A.400.322(2)(j), Idaho Code 18-1507(2)(a) is similar to RCW 9.68A.070 and 18 USC § 2252A(a)(5)(B).

6. Pursuant to WAC 181-86-080, eleven factors, at a minimum, are to be considered to determine the appropriate level and range of educator discipline:

- (1) The seriousness of the act(s) and the actual or potential harm to persons or property;
- (2) The person's criminal history including the seriousness and amount of activity;
- (3) The age and maturity level of participant(s) at the time of the activity;
- (4) The proximity or remoteness of time in which the acts occurred;
- (5) Any activity that demonstrates a disregard for health, safety or welfare;
- (6) Any activity that demonstrates a behavioral problem;
- (7) Any activity that demonstrates a lack of fitness;
- (8) Any information submitted regarding discipline imposed by any governmental or private entity as a result of acts or omissions;
- (9) Any information submitted that demonstrates aggravating or mitigating circumstances;
- (10) Any information submitted to support character and fitness; and
- (11) Any other relevant information submitted.

7. Based on the foregoing facts, and considering them in light of the eleven factors enumerated in WAC 181-86-080, and in light of WAC 181-86-075, RCW 28A.410.090(4), and WAC 181-86, the Educator's education certificate should be permanently revoked.

THEREFORE, it is hereby ordered that the Washington Education Certificate No. 543439D of JEREMY CAMPBELL is **PERMANENTLY REVOKED**.
