

Kindergarten Music Curriculum

1. Purpose: To provide a music curriculum for PK, kindergarten, and first grade students and establish a grant program that provides start-up costs and materials for integrated music curriculum that links together other core curriculum. This curriculum is designed to be used by general education teachers and/or music specialists. Preference shall be given to Title I schools, head start programs, early childhood education and assistance program sites, high poverty school, schools with high mobility, and schools with low student achievement.

2. Description of services provided: Over 30 schools that qualified were provided with a music curriculum for PK – 1st grade materials for an integrated music curriculum that links together other core curriculum.

3. Criteria for receiving services and/or grants: Preference was given to Title I schools, head start programs, early childhood education and assistance program sites, high poverty schools, schools with high mobility, and schools with low student achievement.

9. **Average and range of funding per beneficiary, 2016-17 school year:** The average amount of funding received per school was \$800, with a range of \$400 (approx. per school) to \$1,200 (approx. per school). The average amount funded per student served in the program was \$20 (approx.).
10. **Programmatic changes since inception (if any):** None
11. **Evaluations of program/major findings:** Teacher evaluations of the program this year supported earlier results and the success of the program. Teachers found the program to be well organized, user-friendly, and all-inclusive. Exploring music through movement was well received and the help the program provided in developing 'music language' was greatly appreciated.
12. **Major challenges faced by the program:** More classrooms/schools are wanting kits than the grant could provide.
13. **Future opportunities:** Schools who received the program the last two years, are able to continue with the program at no additional cost.
14. **Statutory and/or Budget language:**
Budget Proviso: 2ESHB 2376 501 (41) \$25,000 of the general fund – state appropriation for fiscal year 2016 and \$25,000 of the general fund – state appropriation for fiscal year 2017 are provided solely for the office of the superintendent of public instruction to partner with a nonprofit organization providing music curriculum for kindergarten and first grade students and establish a grant program that provides start-up costs and materials for integrated music curriculum that links together other core curriculum. Preference shall be given to Title 1 schools, head start programs, early childhood education and assistance program sites, high poverty schools, schools with high mobility, and schools with low student achievement.
15. **Other relevant information:** The program provides general education classroom teachers with tools and resources to provide basic music instruction to their students. Music specialists have reported that the program provides a basis for developing more in depth lessons.
